1	Funding for WISE has now been agreed (the local specialist sexual exploitation service for 13-25 year olds)
2	Seetech representative was questioned about the future of the Inspire Project as they have only agreed to roll over funding for 3 months. However, their response was that they were reviewing all current services and would be visiting Inspire shortly.
3	<p>City Tracker results</p> <p>The percentage of people feeling safe from the City Tracker survey 2014 shows a drop compared with the previous two years. This is in respect or people’s local area and also in the city centre, during the day and after dark.</p> <p>The main change with these data is an increase in the percentage of people reporting that they feel neither safe nor unsafe, and a drop in the percentage of those who report feeling safe. This effect has been seen across a number of other ‘satisfaction’ indicators measured as part of the same survey.</p> <p>Measures of criminal damage and ASB in the environment are performing well.</p>
4	<p>As many are aware, the police are facing significant cuts to their budget that will mean a reduction in police officers. They will need to refocus their resources. This will mean that they will not be able to do everything they used to or that is ‘nice to do’. They will have to be selective based on issues / themes / risks etc. . Brighton & Hove Division will be trialling a new model for the Neighbourhood Police Team (NPT) for a three month period.</p> <p>The trial is looking at a way of maintaining the delivery of crime reduction and operational enforcement of neighbourhood policing in light of the potential challenges that any force restructure may look like.</p> <p>Brighton & Hove NPT is looking to be ahead of the game and demonstrate a model that can be resilient and work best for the City, whilst faced with any potential changes.</p>
